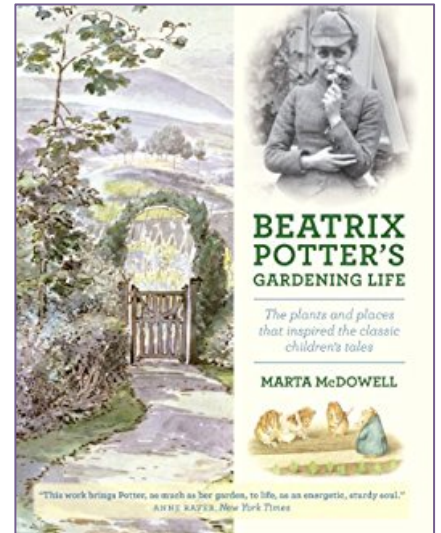


The Broadmoor Garden Club presents

Marta’s recent publications include “The World of Laura Ingalls Wilder: The Frontier Landscapes that Inspired the Little House Books,” and “All the Presidents’ Gardens,” winner of the American Horticulture Society Book Award.
